The City's HUD Entitlement Programs

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

- Supports critical and innovative community development programs, services, and projects
- Serves low-andmoderate income (LMI) persons, households, and neighborhoods
- Directly managed by City

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

- Supports homelessness services related to emergency shelter, outreach, rapid rehousing, and homelessness prevention
- Joint funding collaboration with LCRA, CoC, Homelessness Coalition

HOME Investment Partnerships Grant

- Subsidizes the development of affordable rental housing and homes for sale to first-time homebuyers
- HOME Consortium partner -LCRA serves as lead agency
- City receives annual allocation through Consortium which is approximately \$500,000/year

Planning & Administration: \$284,235



CDBG Strategy





DCED CDBG-CV Public Infrastructure Funding Opportunity

- The Commonwealth has \$55 million available in remaining CDBG-CV funds
- The Commonwealth has identified unmet needs pertaining to public infrastructure improvements (\$51.6 million available statewide)
 - Water System Improvements identified as the highest priority use
- The City has also determined funding for water system improvements to be an unmet need as it relates to the EPA's updated Lead and Copper Rule
- The City intends to apply for competitive CDBG-CV funds for water system improvements
