Amtrak Train Station, Exhibition Display Cases 2024

I. Project Overview

The City of Lancaster Pennsylvania Office of Public Art invites artists to create site-specific work to be exhibited in two glass enclosed cases located on the south side of the Lancaster Amtrak Train Station concourse. The Lancaster Amtrak Station is the second busiest Amtrak station in Pennsylvania, boasting an annual ridership of nearly 600,000 travelers. The station's display cases have historically served as a mode for celebrating local artists and arts organizations through an annually scheduled rotation of exhibitions.

Artwork must be original and should pay specific consideration to the location, site, and environment. Subject matter and material are the artist's choice. Installations must be constrained to two display cases and cannot utilize the concourse outside of the cases. Artists may apply as individuals or as groups. Submissions should include preferred date(s) of installation/deinstallation as outlined in the timeline below.

Finalists will be selected from the pool of submissions by a selection committee using a set of standardized criteria. Selected finalists will be interviewed by the Program Manager via a recorded remote Teams meeting where they will present their proposals. The Public Art Advisory Board (PAAB) will then review the recorded presentations, deliberate, and make its ultimate selection as to which four artists will be awarded the commission.

III. Honorarium \$ 750 per artist (or artist group)

To go toward associated costs of the project, including but not limited to artist's time, fabrication, materials, labor, transportation, and installation.

IV. Eligibility

This commission is open to all professional artists, or a team thereof. Applicants must be 18 years or older. Artists who have been selected for previous Station Cases projects much wait a minimum of 18 months before applying again.

The City of Lancaster, PA and the Public Art Advisory Board (PAAB) will select artists without regard to race, color, religious creed, handicap, ancestry, national origin, age, or gender identity.

V. Considerations


- Works of art must be contained inside two cases
- Alterations to the floor, walls, ceilings, benches, or other area surrounding the cases cannot be considered
- Pedestal furniture is available upon request. The artist may supply their own furniture if desired.
- Cases can only be opened and closed by trained City staff
- Installation and de-installation times will be based on City staff availability and train schedules
- There is no UV coating on the glass of the cases



VII. Submission Requirements

- A statement of interest
- A written description of proposed work
- Drawings, sketches, and/or renderings of proposed work with accompanying descriptions of each image
- A current artist statement and/or bio
- Resume (optional)
- Portfolio that includes 5-10 images of previous artwork relevant to work proposed

VIII. Submission Procedure

To be considered, applicants must submit their proposal on or before Sunday, September 24, 2023. Late or incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

All submission requirement materials must be formatted and combined into **ONE** .PDF FILE.

IX. Selection Criteria

Only submissions that arrive on or before the deadline, fulfill all submission requirements, conform to the submission procedure, and demonstrate the ability to successfully execute and complete the project within the parameters of the project site and scope will be reviewed.

Qualification will be judged based on the artist's 1) vision and distinctive voice, 2) creativity of design and conceptual innovation, 3) artistic merit and mastery of technique, 4) site compatibility, and 5) subject matter appropriateness (as it related to the City and/or local community's identity, expression, ethics, and/or social values).

X. Selection Process

- Submissions will be reviewed by a five-member Selection Committee made up of artists, professionals, and community members. The Public Art Program Manager serves as a non-voting advisor to the committee.
- Projects will be evaluated based on set criteria in a standardized grading rubric.
- Finalist will be notified Friday, September 29, 2023.
- Finalists will be required to present their proposal to the Program Manager via a recorded Teams remote meeting. Scheduled interviews will take place between Monday, October 2 and Friday, October 6.
- The Public Art Advisory Board (PAAB) will review finalist's proposals and recorded interviews and make the ultimate selection as to which finalists will receive the commission.
- Four artists selected by PAAB will be notified Tuesday, October 10, 2023.
